- **Kemp Mill Village / Volunteer Ride Program?** Speakers: Pazit Aviv, Village Coordinator, Montgomery County's Aging and Disabilities Services (HHS); Shawn Brennan, Manager, Mobility and Transportation Program. The village movement has developed around the country to help seniors stay in their homes and age in their own neighborhoods. Villages usually begin as volunteer organizations that can facilitate neighbors helping each other, including providing transportation. The County, federal government, and the Jewish Council on Aging fund efforts to support this.
